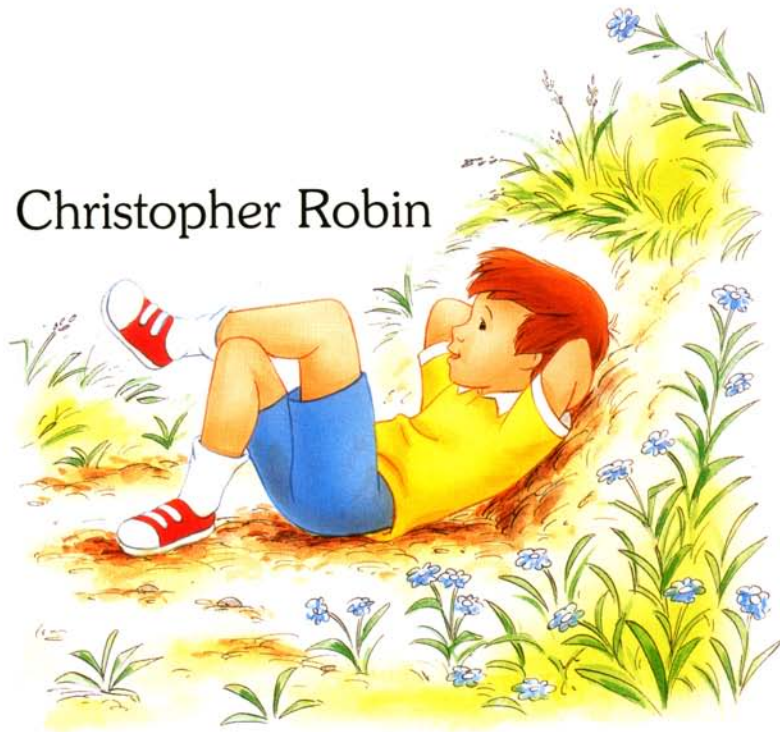

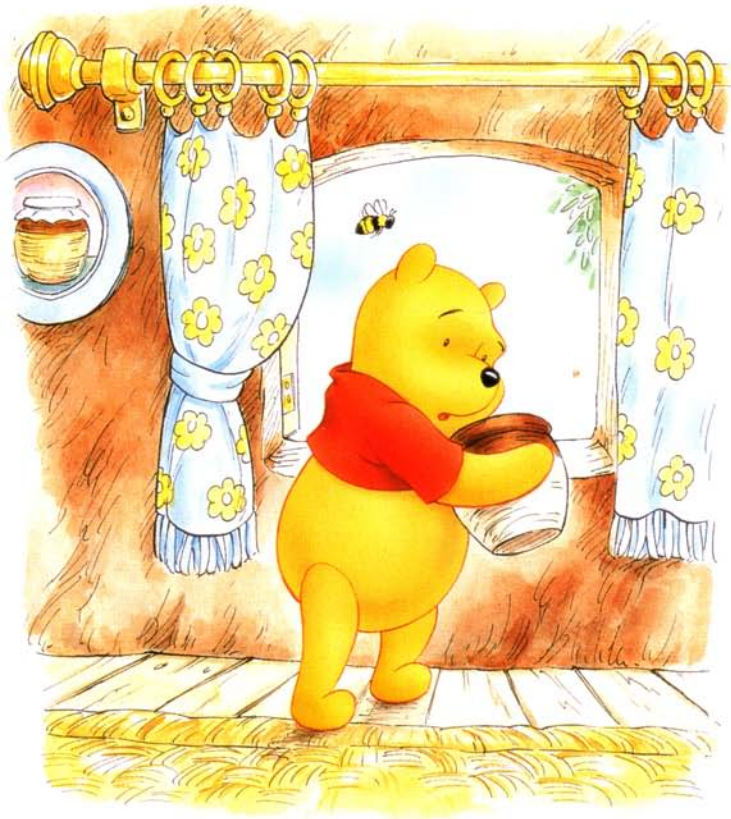


Winnie the Pooh was a fat little bear.

The honey bee went into the wood. And Pooh went into the wood, too.

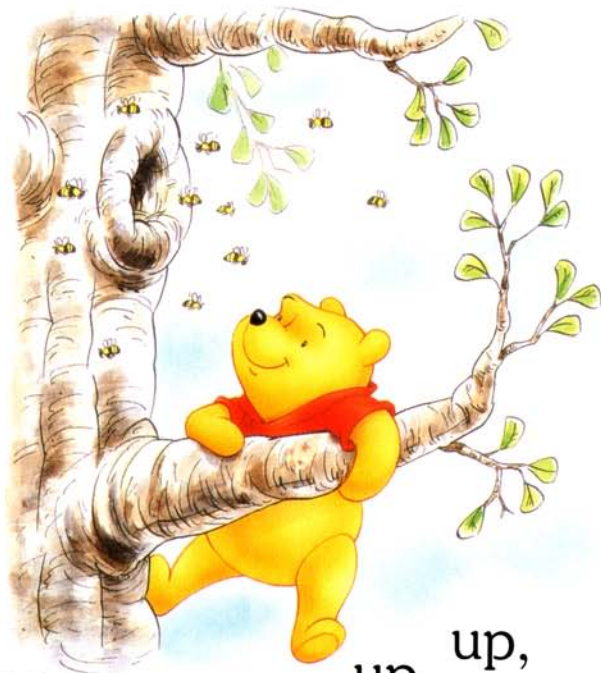




The honey bee went to a big tree. And Pooh went to the big tree, too.

He got some honey.

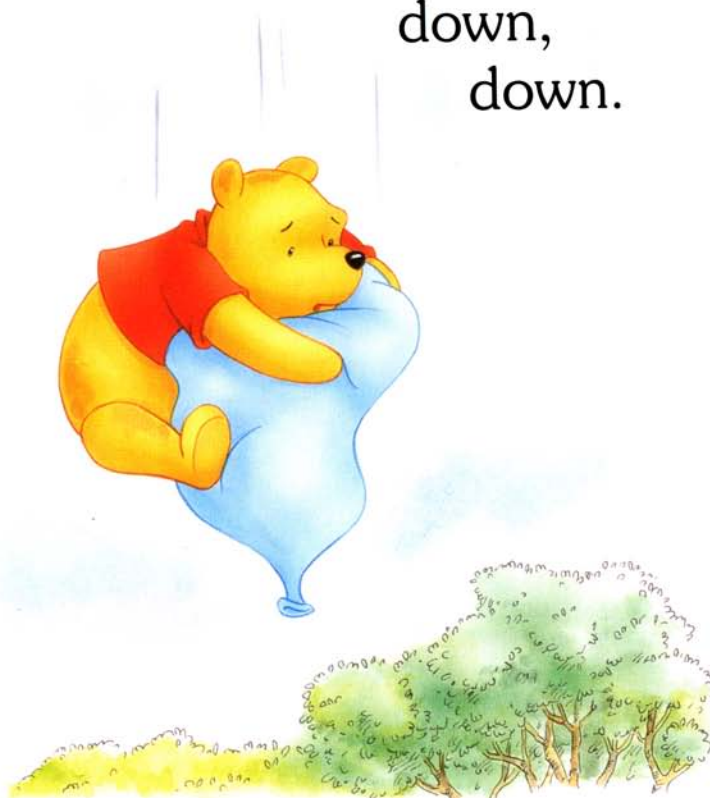


Whoosh!

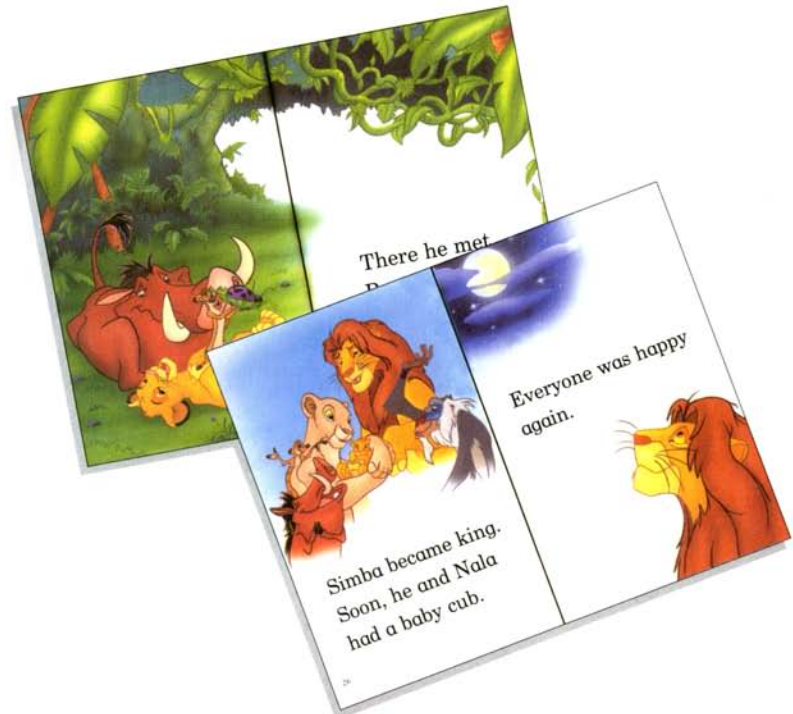
### **About this book**
